# 5.Bury St Edmunds By-Election

The turnout was a low 27.18%

The results:

1st Reform 1,332 28.8% of the votes, 2nd Green Party 1,155 25.0% of the votes, 3rd Conservative 808 17.5% of the votes, 4th Labour 667 14.4% of the votes, 5th Independent 407 8.8% of the votes, 6th LibDem 259 5.6% of the votes. Reform gain from Con with majority 177. But Greens came second!

#### 6. Newsletter:

Update on this quarter's newsletter deliveries 3 rounds of Fakenham done, whilst canvassing found a local volunteer who will do two more rounds. Liz delivered to Happisburgh, Sheringham being delivered by Steve Marsh & Edmund Wright, Southrepps done by Ray, Mike Ward distributed 100 at the Thursday market in North Walsham. New member in Mundesley delivering 700! Volunteers still needed to deliver to rest of constituency as we need to up profile before Mayoral election next year. Liz to telephone local members to seek assistance.

#### 7. Finance

Mike Bossinham informed the meeting that we currently have £1,710 in current account and that a donation had been gifted to the local party.

8. Norfolk & Suffolk Mayoral steering group. .Any member with 1 years membership can stand to be candidate and is welcome to do so in the next 2 weeks. Liz is our representative on this. Understand that all members in Norfolk & Suffolk will have online vote to elect candidate who will stand as Green Party candidate for Mayor of Suffolk & Norfolk. Need 10 proposers 5 of which must be from surrounding local parties. Because election will be next year it is hoped to have candidates in place by end of September. Good news is that the election may be held under a supplementary vote and not first past the post.

### 9. Two news stories for the Web

Ray agreed to do a piece on Green members involvement in the local community. Liz to do piece on contaminated sludge being sprayed onto local farms.

### 10. Guest speaker

Natalie Rothwell-Warn of the Education policy working group addressed the meeting via zoom.

She gave an interesting presentation that caused debate and questions following her presentation. She informed the meeting that the draft voting paper on our Education policy is currently on the website for observations and any possible amendments.

She said that our policy would return education to focus on the well being of children and not be simply be attainment driven. Private schools would lose their charitable status and simply be businesses that would have to pay corporation tax just like any other business. Tuition fees for higher education would be abolished.
